Dear Doctor,

As you know, **scleral and specialty contact lenses** are an exciting technology that can significantly impact the quality of life of many patients suffering from corneal diseases such as keratoconus/keratoglobus, pellucid marginal degeneration, severe ocular surface disease and following corneal trauma, corneal transplant or failed refractive surgery. These lenses can also be fit on normal corneas or corneas with irregular astigmatism that do not respond well to modern soft lenses.

How it works:

Specialty Lens Evaluation

Patients referred to our clinic will receive a comprehensive corneal evaluation including corneal topography, and a complete diagnostic fitting usually done on the first visit. We have numerous diagnostic trial lens kits available on site.


Once lenses are ordered, the patient will likely require one or two follow up visits for modifications and insertion and removal training.

Once the lens evaluation is completed, the patient will be returned to your clinic at intervals as directed by you. It is recommended that the scleral lenses be evaluated yearly as the corneal contour may change. This may also be done at our office per your request.

Many of these scleral and specialty contact lenses are covered under medical and vision insurances. Our staff and doctors are well trained and will provide all the information to the patient.

If you decide to refer us your patient, we ask that you provide the most recent record of their complete eye health evaluation and the patient's contact

information so that we may reach out to them to schedule the appointment and to obtain all insurance information/verification prior and inform the patient of their fees.

Specialty lens eligibility screening:

Specialty lens evaluation/fitting and training-including lenses:

Approx. \$ 2,000 (non-insured)

note: insured rates vary heavily depending on the specific plan and will be provided to the patient at the screening or over the phone.
